Dear Professor Lazarski,

I am close to finishing adapting your generous comments into the Kaleidoscope, after which I will return your comments with a rundown of how I responded to them, in case you might be interested. I have incorporated, one way or another, almost every one of your remarks. I was especially grateful for your clarifying remarks on the Krzyczacy.

That whole topic has always been confusing to me.

I have a question. I am following up on your suggestion to add an entry on the RWPG, which I had considered a long time ago, but then dropped it, thinking it might not be of sufficient interest. But now I am trying to make it interesting.

As I recall, most of the "economic cooperation" under the RWPG was of the bilateral variety, resulting in some surprisingly nice things appearing on the Polish market from time to time, for example, Cuban cigars or canned shrimp, and Hungarian wine.
